First published in 1954, ten years after the author's death, this is a wonderful testament to the human spirit. William Soutar was born and educated in Perth, in Scotland. At the age of 32, he became permanently confined to bed due to a progressive disease of the spine. From here, he produced some of the best poetry in Scots and English of his generation, and entertained a lively succession of friends, artists and writers. He recorded all this in his diaries and journals and, finally, in a record that he called The Diary of a Dying Man. He died in 1943 after 14 years of confinement. On 31st August 1939, on the eve of war, he wrote: "Learned from the air this morning that Germany had invaded Poland at dawn - already many cities are suffering bombardment; the first bomb fell among civilians hours ago. Now we await our own evacuees and the first intimation that the first bomb has fallen upon London. The greatest catastrophe which has erupted in the world is already a fact although the oncoming surge of it has not as..."
